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
#### Our Mission


Hack the Hood is an Oakland-based organization that is harnessing the power of homegrown talent by preparing Bay Area youth of color for opportunities in tech.




# Rooted in Oakland, Serving the San Francisco Bay Area

The San Francisco Bay Area is well-known as a vibrant hub of technology and innovation, however many talented individuals from historically marginalized communities face uphill battles in pursuing careers in the industry.

Hack the Hood is working to dismantle these barriers to help realize a more diverse tech ecosystem. In 2023, our programs reached youth from seven Bay Area counties.

#### Hustle, Build, Drive

At Hack the Hood, we're working to confront tech inequities head-on, recognizing the urgent need to bridge the gap and create pathways to success for young people of color.

#### Our programs feature:

#### **Tech for Justice Curriculum**



Hack the Hood's teaching goes far beyond technical skills. Our one-of-a-kind curriculum integrates racial justice topics and encourages learners to use technology to address social problems. Examples of our Tech for Justice curriculum:



#### **Facial Recognition**

Examines the pervasive issue of racial biases in facial recognition and surveillance technologies and its disproportionate impact on communities of color.



#### **Algorithmic Medicine**

Explores how algorithms and technology impact healthcare diagnoses, treatment, and access to care, particularly in underserved communities.



#### **Speculative Fiction**

Encourages learners to envision a more equitable and inclusive future through technology using creative storytelling and world-building exercises.



## **Workplace Tours**





In the summer, Hustle learners visited our Oakland neighbors at thredUP for a product challenge and networking opportunity with diverse professionals. In the fall, Drive learners toured the cuttingedge labs of Exelixis, an Alameda based company specializing in biotechnology and advancements on cancer treatments.

Our learners took part in a lab tour and career exposure panel where they engaged in discussions with bio-tech experts who generously shared their personal and professional experiences.

We also had the privilege to extend an invitation to select Hack the Hood participants to the RSA cybersecurity conference in San Francisco, courtesy of our partners at SentinelOne. Our participants gained a new, comprehensive understanding of the cybersecurity landscape and cultivated meaningful connections with the SentinelOne team and fellow conference attendees.



#### **Program Partnerships**

We couldn't do this work alone. Hack the Hood is proud to collaborate with a diverse array of partners who provide invaluable resources, expertise, and networks that amplify our impact.



With a decade-long presence in Oakland, Hack the Hood has established a robust relationship with the Oakland Unified School District (OUSD), cultivating a pipeline of OUSD learners engaged in our programs, including students in African American Male Achievement (AAMA) and the Exploring College, Career, and Community Options (ECCCO) program.



Tech Exchange

Oakland-based Tech Exchange has been instrumental in supporting Hack the Hood's mission by generously offering deeply discounted digital devices, which have played a pivotal role in empowering our learners. This collaboration exemplifies the synergy between our organizations in fostering digital inclusivity and narrowing the digital divide.



We're now in our third year of partnership with Laney College! Through our Drive program, learners enroll at Laney College and complete their Certificate of Achievement in Data Science while receiving mentorship, career navigation, and wraparound support from Hack the Hood.



#### **Program Partnerships**



In partnership with NPower, Hack the Hood learners and alumni now gain priority admission to NPower's advanced certification programs in cybersecurity and cloud computing, marking an exciting chapter for us as we expand our tech-centered certifications and career pathways.



First Place for Youth participants receive priority admission to Hack the Hood programs, all while benefiting from dedicated support from their case managers. This collaboration represents a concerted effort to amplify our collective commitment to historically underrepresented and marginalized populations, addressing barriers to education and employment opportunities.



This year, Hack the Hood proudly entered a new partnership with Life Science Cares (LSC) to facilitate connections with prominent life science companies such as Exelexis and Sangamo and internship opportunities through their Project Onramp initiative.


Volunteer and Mentor Hours


# Year-to-Year Comparison of Key Metrics 2022 & 2023




